





Skips, Steps, Repeats


Notes may move three different ways: skips, steps, repeats.



1. Write "sk" for skip; "st" for step, and "r" for repeat.



2. Circle skips and steps that move up with red. Circle skips and steps that move down with blue. Circle repeats with green.









Line Notes on the Staff

G is on the bottom line of the bass clef. From a line to a line is a skip. A skip up from G is B etc.


7. Draw the letter names of the notes on the lines of the staff. Play these notes in the correct place on the keyboard.




Notes on the lower part of the keyboard are written on the lower part of the staff. Notes in the middle of the keyboard are written on the middle part of the staff. Notes on the upper part of the keyboard are written on the upper part of the staff.


Practice naming and playing the line notes on the *Bastien Music Flashcards* until you can recognize them easily.



F is in the space below the bass clef. From a space to a space is a skip. A skip up from F is A etc.


21. Draw the letter names of the notes in the spaces. Play these notes in the correct place on the keyboard.




The notes in the bass staff are found on the lower part of the keyboard. The notes in the treble staff are found on the upper part of the keyboard.
