Melodic intervals have two notes that are played separately, one at a time.




Harmonic intervals have two notes that are played together.





Sharp Sign

The **sharp sign** before a note means to play the next key to the **right**.

The sharp sign lasts for the whole measure.




9. Draw a sharp sign before each note with a # over or under it. Play and name these notes.

The **flat sign** before a note means to play the next key to the **left**.

on a **line**


or in a space.
